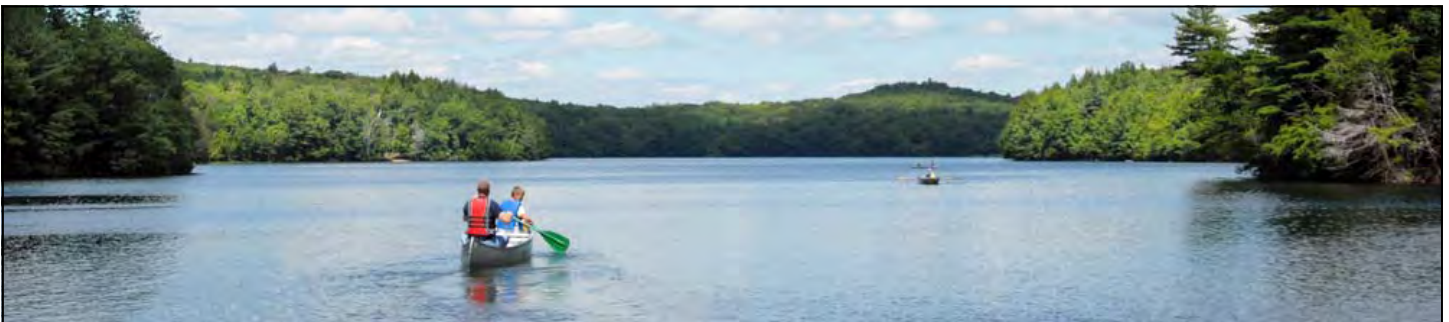

Hemlock Woolly Adelgid is an invasive insect which slowly kills hemlocks trees. Hemlocks are important to wildlife and stream quality, their decline has cascading impacts on aesthetics and ecosystems. However, early detections of HWA give us a fighting chance.
